

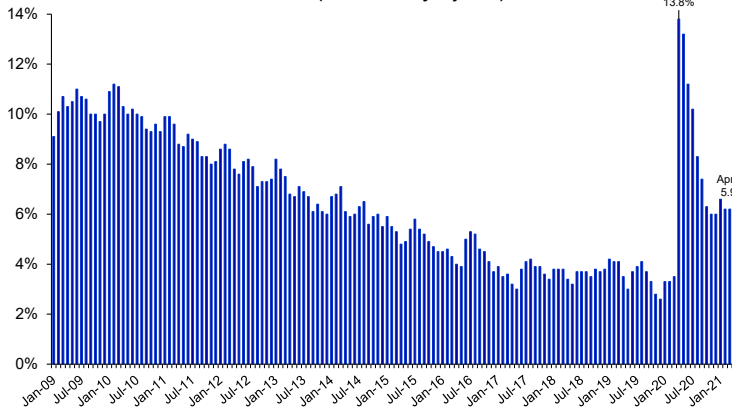

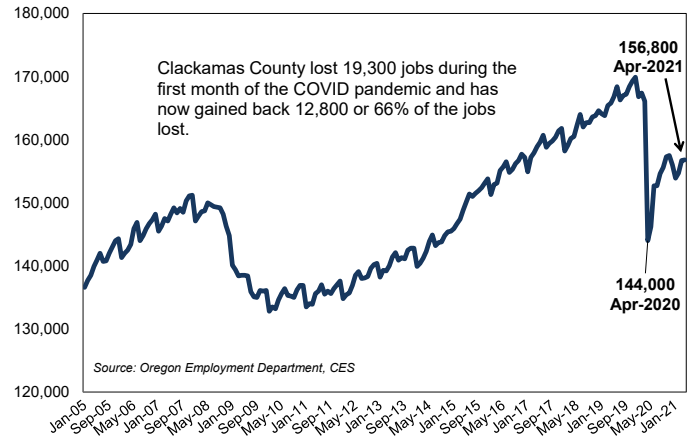

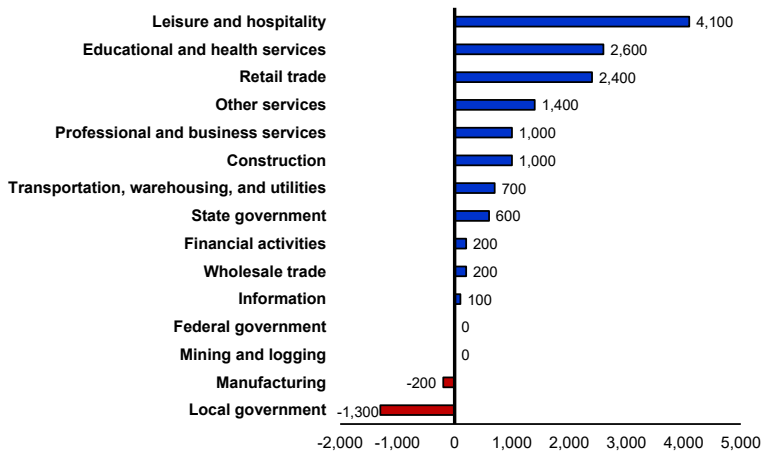
Unemployment Rate, Clackamas County

2005-2021 (by place of business) *not seasonally adjusted*



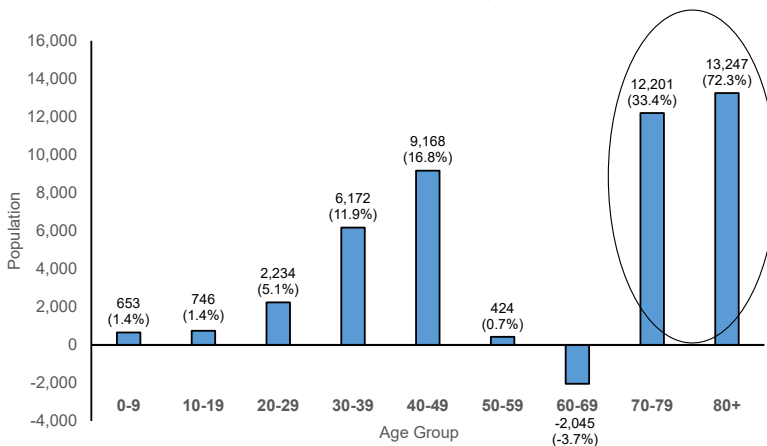
Net Employment Gains/Losses: Apr 2020 to Apr 2021

The *unadjusted* unemployment rate in Clackamas County has now dropped from 13.8% in April 2020 to 5.9% in April 2021.

- The unadjusted unemployment rate decreased slightly to 5.9% in April from 6.2% in the previous month with 13,145 residents unemployed.
- Clackamas County's nonfarm employment level reached 156,800 in April. The county has now gained back 66% of the jobs lost during the spring of 2020.
- Since April 2020, the industries with the highest job-growth included leisure and hospitality (4,100); private education and health services (2,600); retail trade (2,400); and other services (1,400).

Population 70 Years and Older is Projected to Grow the Fastest in the Next Decade.

- The oldest segment of the population (70+ years) living in Clackamas County is projected to increase by 25,448 or by 46.4% by 2030.
- In contrast, the youngest segment of the population (19 years or younger) is projected to increase by 1,399 or by 1.4% and the mid-range working age population (20-49 years) is projected to increase by 17,997 or by 8.7% in the next decade.
