

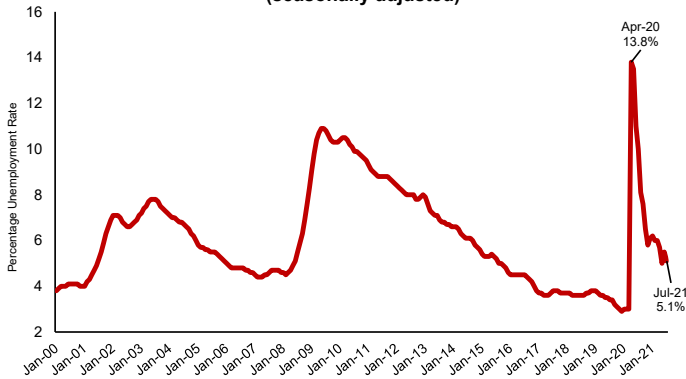

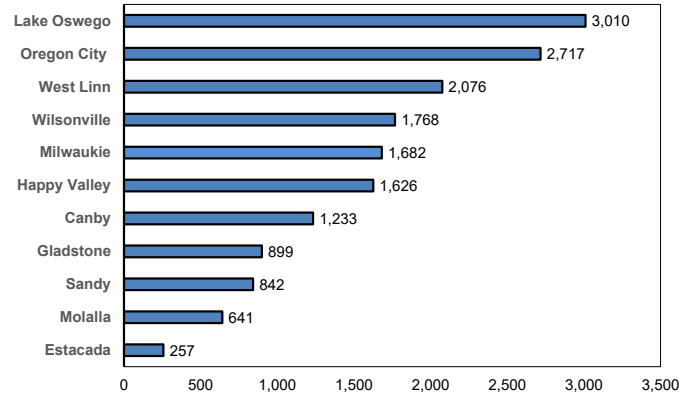


Clackamas County

(seasonally adjusted)



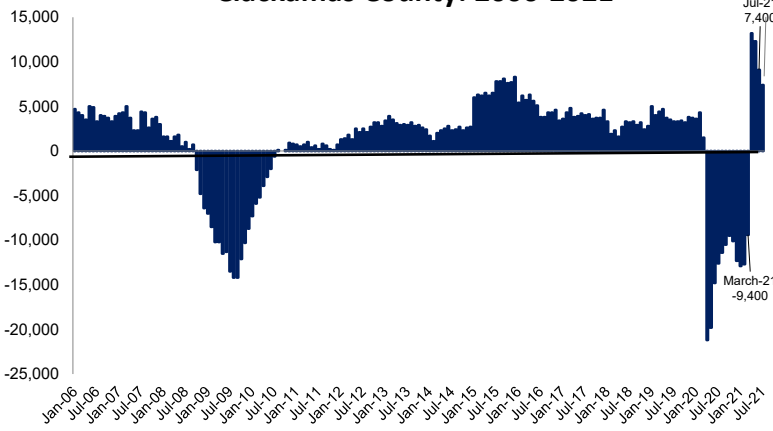

Clackamas County: 2006-2021

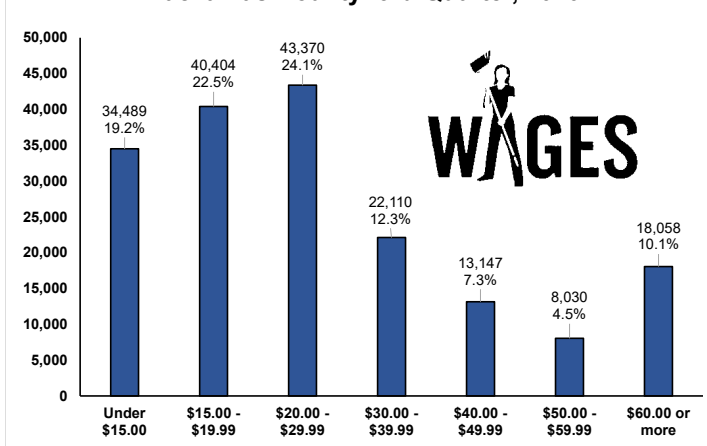

The *seasonally adjusted* unemployment rate in Clackamas County has now dropped from a high of 13.8% in April 2020 to 5.1% in July 2021.

- The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate fell to 5.1% in July from 5.5% in the previous month. The number of unemployed residents fell to 11,411 in July from 12,345 in June.
- Current employment growth within all cities in Clackamas County has been positive nearing 17% since the bottom of the recession.
- The county's year-over-year employment growth in July reached 7,400 compared to the last negative growth numbers in March at -9,400.

Number of Jobs by Hourly Wage Level, Clackamas County: 3rd Quarter, 2020



Nearly one-fourth of residents in Clackamas County earned less than \$15 an hour in 2020.

- The bottom tier wage workers in Clackamas County earning less than \$15 made up 34,489 or 19.2% of employment in 2020. Many of these workers work in leisure and hospitality, private households, and retail trade.
- The largest portion of wages were from workers earning \$15.00 - \$19.99 (22.5%) and workers earning \$20.00 - \$29.99 (24.1%).
- Nearly 15% or 26,088 of workers were in the highest tier categories earning a wage of \$50 or more in 2020. Examples of industries employing these workers include information, finance, and insurance.
